SENTENCING CONSIDERATIONS

- -If minor (under 16) passenger is in the vehicle, all fines, jail and revocations are doubled. Third and Fourth offenses become felonies.
- -Driver Safety Plan Are Required in All Cases
 - -Fines & Forfeitures may be reduced in cases of inability to pay with reduction in amount applied to surcharge/plan costs.
 - -Plan may have victim awareness component including effect on victim and victim's family
 - -Restitution may be ordered by the Court.
 - -Community Service MUST be ordered by the Court to reduce the fine or forfeiture if offender cannot pay fine. Court to determine amount of reduction in fine for each hour of community service work performed. §346.65(2g)(ag), Stats
 - -Site Visits to Emergency Room or Alcohol Treatment Facility may be ordered.
- **-Points** are assigned by the DMV in all cases (6).
- -Huber privileges are NOT available unless the offender complies with Alcohol Surcharge, Ignition Interlock Orders, and Driver Safety Plan. (Exception for offender who cannot comply because of insufficient funds to obtain surcharge) §303.065(2m), Stats.

Effective 01/01/01, offenses committed before 01/01/89 are not counted for penalty purposes. For an offense occurring more than ten (10) years ago, but after 1988, a second offense is charged as a first offense, however. the offense remains on the record and a third offense is charged as a third offense. (Exception: Prior offenses for Homicide by Intoxicated Use of a Motor Vehicle, §940.09(1), Stats., and Causing Great Bodily Harm by Intoxicated Use of a Motor Vehicle §940.25, Stats., will be included without restriction as to the date of the offense.)

AGGRAVATING AND MITIGATING FACTORS

The guidelines which follow suggest what may be appropriate penalties in situations which are either aggravated and not aggravated. The presence or absence of mitigating or aggravating circumstances in each case will dictate into which of the two matrixes the case more readily fit.

If the mitigating factors dominate, then the "Not Aggravated" matrix would seem appropriate, with the degree of mitigation dictating the choice of what penalties, within the confines of the appropriate grid, ought to be imposed. If the aggravating factors dominate, then that matrix would seem appropriate, with the degree of aggravation dictating what penalties, within the confines of the appropriate grid, should be employed.

Some examples of mitigating factors are:

- --No evidence of unsafe driving other than intoxication
- --No accident
- --No or minimal prior offence record in Wisconsin and elsewhere
- --Cooperation with arresting officers
- -- No injury to others
- --No minor passengers
- --Extrajudicial penalties (loss of job, etc.)
- --Responsible efforts to deal with problem
- --Low income (as to financial aspects of penalty only)

Some examples of aggravating factors are:

- --Driving after revocation
- --Accident
- -- Unsafe driving beyond mere intoxication
- --Injury to others
- -- Prior uncounted offences for OWI
- --lengthy prior driving record for other types of offences
- -- Time and location of driving
- --Interval since last offence
- --Failure to comply with surcharge ordered in the past
- -- Lack of insurance coverage

OCCUPATIONAL LICENSES

1. Waiting Period

1st offenders who have taken the test are eligible for an immediate occupational license.

All others are eligible after the expiration of a 45 day waiting period, and proof that they have:

- -completed the required statutory assessment
- -they are in compliance with the ordered drivers safety plan
- -they are in compliance with Ignition Interlock requirements

2. Surcharge & Plan

After 2^{nd} or subsequent OWI or OWI-related offense, applicant must have completed the current surcharge and be complying with the driver safety plan.

3. **Absolute Sobriety**

An absolute sobriety (0.0%) requirement is imposed on all operation by users who have two or more OWI or OWI-related offenses

4. **Ignition Interlock**

Applicant must comply with all requirement of the use of vehicles equipped with a functioning ignition interlock device if applicants vehicles were ordered to have the ignition interlock placed on them under §346.65(6)(a). See 343.10(5)(a)3., Stats.

IGNITION INTERLOCK

- 1. INSTALLATION MANDATORY Ignition Interlock Devices (IID) installation is MANDATORY in all vehicles owned or driven by persons convicted of second and subsequent OWI related offenses.
- 2. FIRST OFFENSE -1^{ST} OWI offenses require IID installation for one year if the BAC is .15 or higher.
- 3. HARDSHIP EXCEPTIONS Defendants are to pay for the installation and maintenance costs of the IID, however, in cases of extreme financial hardship, the Court may:
 - a. Exclude vehicles from the IID requirement
 - b. Not order IID at all
 - c. If offenders have income levels at or below 150% of the federal poverty level and IID's are ordered, the installation and monitoring costs are reduced in half after the payment of the surcharge fee.
- 4. LENGTH OF RESTRICTION The IID restriction period must be at least one year and may not extend beyond the maximum license revocation period for a particular OWI related offense or refusal violation.
- 5. START OF RESTRICTION The IID restriction period does not start until an offender obtains an operators license, not at the time the IID was ordered in Court. The revocation period does not start until completion of the term of imprisonment imposed.
- 6. HUBER PRISONERS Huber prisoners are required to provide proof of the IID installation within two weeks of the issuance of the IID order to qualify for Huber privileges.
- 7. DELAY IN INSTALLATION Judges may order installation at a time later than sentencing, such as the date upon which the offender becomes eligible for an occupational license.
- 8. REMOVAL OR TAMPERING WITH IID If an offender removes or tampers with the IID, (as required to be reported by the monitoring agency) the period of time the IID restriction remains in place will be extended by 6 months.
- 9. REFUSAL SAME RESULT IID's are required for First Offense when the offender refuses to submit to an evidentiary breath or blood test. (A refusal)
- 10. LOWER BAC WHEN USING IID Offenders subject to an IID restriction have a BAC level of 0.02 during the entire duration of the IID order. Violation of such an order will subject an offender to the same potential penalties that another OWI charge would have, including jail time and fines.
